Physical and Chemical Hazards: Stable under normal conditions. No risk of explosion or spontaneous combustion.

Section 4: First Aid Measures

4.1 Inhalation: Move to fresh air. Keep airway open. If experiencing breathing discomfort or coughing, administer oxygen. If symptoms persist, seek medical attention.

4.2 Skin Contact: Immediately remove contaminated clothing. Rinse with flowing water for 10-15 minutes. If redness, swelling, or itching occurs, apply skin care ointment. Seek medical attention if discomfort persists.

4.3 Eye Contact: Hold eyelids open. Rinse continuously with water for at least 15 minutes. If severe irritation occurs, seek treatment at a hospital ophthalmology department.

4.4 Ingestion: Do NOT induce vomiting to prevent aspiration of vomiting into the lungs. Do not drink any liquids. Seek medical attention immediately. Do not feed anything to a person with impaired consciousness.

Section 5: Fire-Fighting Measures

Hazard Characteristics: Combustible liquid. May burn when exposed to high heat or open flame.

Hazardous Combustion Products: Carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, small amounts of sulfur oxide.

Suitable Extinguishing Media: Dry chemical powder, carbon dioxide, foam.

Fire-Fighting Precautions: Firefighters should fight fire from upwind direction, wearing self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) and thermal protective equipment.

Section 6: Accidental Release Measures

1. Personnel Protection: Emergency responders should wear rubber gloves.

2. Environmental Protection: Prevent spilled material from entering sewers, rivers, lakes, and other water bodies.

3. Spill Cleanup Methods:

Small Spills: Absorb with dry sand, earth, or inert absorbent material. Collect into sealed containers. Handle as hazardous waste. Alternatively, flush with large amounts of water.

Large Spills: Construct dikes or excavation pits to contain the spill. Use explosion-proof pumps to transfer to dedicated collection containers, or dilute with large amounts of water and route to the wastewater treatment system.

Section 7: Handling and Storage

1. Handling: Operate in well-ventilated areas. Avoid contact with eyes, skin, and clothing.
Wash hands thoroughly after handling. Use explosion-proof electrical, ventilation, and lighting equipment. Do not use tools that may produce sparks.
2. Storage: Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated warehouse. Storage temperature should not exceed 50C. Keep away from heat sources. Keep containers tightly closed. Store separately from oxidizers, strong acids, and strong bases. Do not store together.

1. Engineering Controls: Provide adequate ventilation.
2. Respiratory Protection: Wear a respirator (half-face mask) when ventilation is poor or vapor concentration is too high.
3. Eye Protection: Wear chemical safety goggles.
4. Skin and Body Protection: Wear rubber or nitrile gloves.
5. Other Protection: No eating or drinking in the workplace. Wash hands thoroughly with water after work.

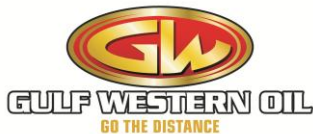
